Police and Community Together (PACT) meetings are back, along with an increase in our surgeries, now we are sufficiently beyond the Covid pandemic, which is great for community involvement.



PACT meetings are for ourselves, partners and pillars of the community to come together to try and resolve regular reported crimes. Working together to make our communities safer!






## The Manchester Bee



The British Ironwork Centre, based in Oswestry, Shropshire, has worked alongside GMP to create The Bee monument.

Thousands of weapons were given to The British Ironwork Centre foundry in order for them to create the sculpture. All of which had been collected from the streets of Manchester and donated by GMP from the Forever Amnesty bins.

The weapons were surrendered as part of the force's 'Forever Knife Amnesty', which is now sees secure knife bins permanently available at police stations across Greater Manchester.

The Bee has started its tour in Tameside, visiting various schools and being used to educate young people on the dangers of knife crime.

## Latest Updates

**#CHARGED | 29yr old male charged and remanded in to custody after threatening to blow up Ashton Police Station**

On Tuesday 14th June 2022, an officer at Ashton Police Station received a threat via a phone call from a known male, stating he was on his way to blow up Ashton-under-Lyne Police Station. A immediate search of the local area was then conducted, resulted in the male being located and arrested at an address in #Ashton.

Officers from GMP Tameside's North Neighbourhood Policing Team, interviewed the male in relation to this offence and then sought a charging decision from the Crown Prosecution Service for this and two further threats to bomb Ashton Police Station in January and February 2022.

Luke NUTTALL B.27/09/1992, of Rupert Street, Reddish has been charged with the following offences:

- Malicious communications - send communication conveying a threatening message (relates to a threat made to bomb Ashton Police Station on 05/01/2022)
- Malicious communications - send communication conveying a threatening message (relates to a threat made to bomb Ashton police station on 02/02/2022)
- Malicious communications - send communication conveying a threatening message (relates to a threat made on 14/06/2022)
- Bomb hoax - communicate false information (relates to threat to bomb Ashton Police Station on 14/06/2022)

NUTTALL was remanded in custody to to appear at Tameside Magistrates Court this morning (Thursday 16th June). When he appeared, NUTTALL pleaded guilty to all charges and was remanded in to custody to re-appear on 7th July 2022.



**#JAILED | 26yr old male jailed after making threats and racial remarks in #Ashton**

Joe WHARTON B.30/04/1996 of no fixed abode has been jailed for 6 weeks after an incident at a homeless shelter in Ashton-under-Lyne.

On Tuesday evening, 14th June 2022, WHARTON attended at The Townhouse on Burlington Street, Ashton, where he had previously been banned from.

When asked to leave by staff, he became verbally abusive, making homophobic comments and threats to stamp on the victim's head. He left the site, but returned a short time later where he made further comments, some of a racial nature.

Officers from GMP Tameside's North Neighbourhood Policing Team at Ashton attended the location and arrested WHARTON.

He was taken into custody and interviewed in relation to these allegations, following which he was charged with the two offences:

- Racially Aggravated harassment, alarm or distress (S5 Public Order Act)
- Intention harassment, alarm or distress (S4A Public Order Act)

WHARTON was remanded in custody to appear at Tameside Magistrates Court this morning (Thursday 16th June), where he pleaded guilty to the charges and was handed a 6 week prison sentence.



## BURGLARY

### Become a creature of habit

Try to get into the habit of following your own course of action when you lock up your home. This will ensure that you don't forget anything.

Here's what we recommend you do before you go out:

- close and lock all your doors and windows, even if you're only going out for a few minutes
- double-lock any door
- make sure that any valuables are out of sight
- keep handbags away from the letterbox or cat flap and hide all keys including car keys, as a thief could hook keys or valuables through even a small opening
- never leave car documents or ID in obvious places such as kitchens or hallways
- in the evening, shut the curtains and leave lights on
- if you're out all day, then it's advisable to use a timer device to automatically turn lights and a radio on at night
- set your burglar alarm
- make sure the side gate is locked
- lock your shed or garage, lock your bike inside a secure shed or garage, to a robust fitting bolted to the ground or wall, like a ground anchor

### Going away?

Here are five tips to help you keep your home and belongings stay safe while you're away:

1. if you're off on holiday and wish to post anything on social media, make sure your posts aren't public and that they're only seen by your friends
2. leave lights and a radio on a timer to make the property appear occupied
3. get a trusted neighbour to keep an eye on your property or join a Neighbourhood or resident Watch Scheme
4. consider asking your neighbours to close curtains after dark and to park on your drive



## SPIKED DRINKS AND DATE-RAPE

Spiking, where someone adds drugs or alcohol to another person's drink without them knowing, is illegal. Whether it's done as a prank or with the intent to steal from or assault the victim here are some ways to avoid this happening to you or your friends.

### Be vigilant if you're drinking with strangers

When you go out for an evening you never know who you're going to meet, so always keep your wits about you. If someone appears to be over-friendly and eager to get you to drink, be vigilant.

If you get separated from your friends in a bar, pub or club, let them know where you are. If you happen to meet new company and they ask you to go on somewhere else, introduce them to your friends and tell them where you're going.

### Never lose sight of your drink

It can take only minutes for someone to feel the effects of a spiked drink. Memory loss can be a side effect of many of the drugs used to spike drinks. Many victims are unaware of what has happened to them, and have very little memory of the incident, if any at all.

The best way to protect yourself and your friends from being spiked is to be aware of what you consume and never take a drink that you haven't seen being prepared in front of you. Never leave your drink unattended, even for a moment, and if it doesn't taste right, don't finish it.

If you or your friends start to feel strange or unwell then you should get help and seek medical advice straight away.

### Be a drink buddy

If you're out with a friend, or friends, keep an eye out for them. If they appear to be more drunk than you'd expect, dizzy or slurring their words, take control and make sure they're okay. If you're concerned, make sure they either get medical help or get home safely.
